


Even though works do not define the *depth* of our faith, they should still be considered an *integral part* of our faith. James 2:18 addresses this in saying "But someone will say, "*You have faith; I have deeds.*" Show me your faith without deeds, and I will show you my faith by my deeds. You believe that there is one God. Good! Even the demons believe that—and shudder."

Faith is complete trust and confidence in God, but there are actions that stem from that faith. The first action, which could also be considered inaction, requires us to submit ourselves to God. While submissiveness implies the lack of action, choosing to submit ourselves, our troubles, and the things we hold dear to God requires a choice from us. Continual faith in God is continual surrender to His plan. As you begin to practice this, you will find it is actually very hard to do nothing about the things you can't control. It rejects the laws of human nature by asking you to stop trying to do it all by yourself.

The second action in faith is in gratitude to God. He gave us the gift of grace that we are so undeserving of, and in thanks to Him I consider it my responsibility to return the same grace to others. How hypocritical would I be to withhold my forgiveness for others when God forgives me unconditionally when I ask Him? If I can deem others as unworthy of my grace, wouldn't He be right to withhold grace from me, too?

His grace is abundant, and I am responsible to show that same grace to others. The most important commandments Jesus mentioned were to love God with all your heart, soul, and mind, and to love your neighbor as yourself. Loving others requires action, and as believers it is a part of our faith in God to do His will. I want to obey Him because I am so thankful for all that he has given me.

As God has given you endless grace and love that surpasses all understanding, we should submit our lives to Him and serve Him in all that we do. As it says in Matthew 10:8, "Freely you have received, freely give." We give, not because we owe him or are working to earn His forgiveness, but because of our genuine gratitude for His gift.

#### JOHN MARK THE GOSPEL WRITER



John Mark was a disciple of Peter, and many scholars believe that the Gospel of Mark is mainly the preaching of Peter put into writing. It is believed the Gospel was written in Rome between 60 and 70 A.D. In examination of the four Gospels there are many features in common, but Matthew, Mark and Luke have many specific similarities and is why they are called the Synoptic Gospels. The Majority of New Testament scholars believe that Matthew and Luke used Mark as a major source. Mark can be distinguished from the other synoptic Gospels (Matthew & Luke) by the absence of the birth of Christ and Genealogy and by a similar amount of material containing the teachings of Jesus. In studying the Gospels, I recommend you start with Mark, Matthew and Luke. John was written last and covers a different time span.

The message of Mark is that Jesus is the Messiah and son of God, whose death and resurrection paid the penalty for our sins and achieved victory over Satan, sin and death. Jesus is a savior who is truly divine, truly man and who gives his life uniquely as substitute atonement for our sins. I like what Mark says about prayer 11:24-25 "therefore I tell you, whatever you ask for in prayer, believe that you have received it, and it will be yours. And when you stand praying, if you hold anything against anyone, forgive them, so that your father in heaven may forgive your sins."

Not much is known about Mark. The Apostles used his mothers house for meetings. Mark would have been a teenager when Christ walked this Earth. Mark was not an Apostle as he was not chosen by Christ. Mark made a trip with Paul and Barnabas in Asia minor but Paul and Mark had some friction and Mark was not asked to join Paul on his second missionary journey. Mark and Paul started working together at a later date as Mark was with Paul when Paul was martyred in Rome.

Mark was probably the first bishop of Alexandria, Egypt. He may have founded the church of Alexandria. The Pagans of Alexandria resented Mark taking away people from their pagan gods. The pagans tied a rope around his neck and drug him through the streets until he died. In 828, relics of Mark were stolen from Alexandria and taken to Venice, Italy. They are on display in St. Mark's cathedral in St. Mark's square.
